



MAER-Net Colloquium at the Zeppelin University October 12-14, 2017

The eleventh annual international MAER-Net colloquium will be held at the Zeppelin University, October 12-14, 2017. Meta-Analysis of Economics Research Network, [MAER-Net](#), is an international network of scholars who specialize in or use meta-analysis to understand economics and business. The purpose of the colloquium is to share ideas and methods among meta-analysts and to introduce young scholars to this rapidly growing field.
