

Biographical notes

Antonella Besussi teaches Political Philosophy at the University of Milan. Her research interests concern normative political theory and political philosophy with particular reference to methodological and theoretical questions.

Gian-Luigi Bulsei teaches Applied Sociology at the Department of Humanistic Studies of the University of Eastern Piedmont, where coordinates the Interdisciplinary Research Centre on Local Societies; his scientific production covers topics such as: environment, society and public policies; health, welfare and participatory processes; no profit organizations and sustainable development. Among his recent publications: “Essere comunità in condizioni avverse”, *Sociologia urbana e rurale*, 2016; “La scienza utile. Expertise e partecipazione nelle decisioni pubbliche”, *Biblioteca della libertà*, 2017; *Innovazione sociale e politiche urbane: cos'altro sono le città se non persone?*, Atti del Convegno “Politica, Città e Sistemi sociali”, Sapienza, Università di Roma, 2018.

Carlo Burelli is a Post-doctoral Researcher at the University of Eastern Piedmont. He works at the intersection of political theory and political science, as his research is broadly interested in clarifying what can, and should hold together today's large and conflictual societies. This vast question led him to cross various debates: utopian and realist political theory, theories of justice and theories of legitimacy, solidarity and equality in contemporary political societies. He completed his PhD at the University of Milan, under the supervision of prof. Antonella Besussi. He then joined the ERC research project

RESCEU with Maurizio Ferrera. He also won personal research grants from the University of Genova and the Center of Advanced Studies (South East Europe). During these years, he was visiting scholar at the universities of Freiburg, Cambridge, Amsterdam and Frankfurt and published a monography on Thomas Hobbes (*E fu lo Stato*, Mimesis 2010) and many scientific articles on important international (*Critical Review of International Social and Political Philosophy*, *Journal of Common Market Studies*) and national journals (*Politeia*, *Politiche Sociali*, *Biblioteca della libertà*).

Corrado Fumagalli is a Post-doctoral Researcher in political philosophy at LUISS-Guido Carli, where he works on hate speech, disagreement, comparative political philosophy, and democratic theory. Among his recent publications, *Fake news, post-verità e politica* (coedited with Giulia Bistagnino); *Innovazioni Democratiche* (coedited with Enrico Biale); “Democratic representation and democratic sanctions”, *Representation*; “When Do They Speak? Deliberation and Democratic Decision-Making in the European Union”, *Political Studies*; “Propositional attitudes, harm and public hate speech situations: towards a maieutic approach”, *European Journal of Political Theory*.

Anna Elisabetta Galeotti is Full Professor of Political Philosophy at the University of Eastern Piedmont, Vercelli. Her research interests range from toleration, multiculturalism, equal respect, to deception and self-deception in politics. Among her English publications: *Toleration as Recognition*, Cambridge University Press (2002); “Self-deception: Intentional plan or mental event?”, *Humana Mente* (2012); “Liars or self-deceived. Reflection on political deception”, *Political Studies* (2014); “Autonomy and cultural practices: The risk of double standards”, *European Journal of Political Theory* (2015); “The range of toleration”, *Philosophy and Social Criticism* (2015); “The attribution of responsibility to self-deceivers”, *Journal of Social Philosophy* (2016); “Cultural conflicts: A deflationary approach”, *Critical Review of International Social and Political Philosophy* (2017); *Political Self-Deception*, Cambridge University Press (2018).

Cristina Meini is Associate Professor of Philosophy of Mind and Philosophy of Communication at the University of Eastern Piedmont, and member of the FINO PhD program in Philosophy. Her main fields of research include philosophy of mind and philosophy of cognitive sciences, notably the nature,

development and pathologies of mindreading and self-consciousness. She is the author of many books and scientific articles, published both in Italian and international journals.

Nicola Riva is Associate Professor of Philosophy of Law at the Department of Social and Political Sciences of the University of Milan. His research interests are in the analysis and construction of normative concepts, principles and arguments, and in their implications as regards the politics of law, combining the approaches of analytical philosophy and critical theory. His publications include the books *Eguaglianza delle opportunità* (Aracne, 2011) and *Egalitarismi. Conzezioni contemporanee della giustizia* (Giappichelli, 2016) and the anthology *Eguaglianza* (Laterza, 2017), that collects texts by classical and contemporary authors in the Western philosophical tradition.
