

Elvio Baccharini is Professor of Ethics and Political Philosophy at the University of Rijeka (Croatia), he has published books on public reason and biotechnologies, the political philosophy of J. S. Mill, moral epistemology, and practical ethics. His articles have appeared in *The Journal of Medical Ethics*, *Grazer Philosophische Studien*, *International Studies in the Philosophy of Science*, *Acta Analytica*, and other academic journals. He has delivered guest lectures at the University of Oxford, Universitat Pompeu Fabra in Barcelona, Freie Universität Berlin, the University of Iceland in Reykjavik, the University of Amsterdam, the University of Bologna, Vita-Salute San Raffaele University in Milan, and several other institutions. He has taught as an adjunct professor at Ruhr University Bochum, the State University of Milan, and Vita-Salute San Raffaele University in Milan. Additionally, he has been an Erasmus guest lecturer at the Leibniz University of Hannover, Vita-Salute San Raffaele University, the universities of Potsdam, Pavia, Eastern Piedmont in Vercelli, and Antwerp.
