

Giacomo Franzoso is a PhD student in Legal Sciences, specifically in Sociology of Law, deviance and social change, at the Department of Law, Political and International Studies of the University of Parma. His research – under the supervision of prof. Chiara Scivoletto – in the field of Restorative Justice focuses on the RJ landscape in the Italian context in the light of the recently introduced “organic discipline” (contained in d.lgs. n. 150/2022) with a normative, socio-legal and qualitative empirical approach. He holds a Master’s degree in Law from the University of Trento, supervised by prof. Andrea di Nicola, and a First-degree Master in Critical Criminology and Social Security from the University of Padua. His literary work has reflected his research interests, revolving around Restorative Justice on the one hand, and prison studies on the other, exploring the relationship between them. He has also touched upon the victimological subject and compensation for crime victims.
